

**Know all Men by these Presents,**

that Bela Wilkes of Abington in the County of Plymouth  
and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and Warren  
Walker of Rockland in said County and Commonwealth  
wealthy.

In consideration of Thirty-five Hundred Dollars to us  
paid by The Inhabitants of the Town of Abington a municipality  
established and existing under the laws of said Commonwealth  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said  
Inhabitants of said town in their said municipal capacity  
a certain plot or parcel of land with the buildings  
and other improvements thereon, lying in said Abington  
bounded and described as follows: Northerly by Island

Grove Pond, land of Cornelius Flavin and Easterly  
by land of John Rockwood and lands now or formerly  
of Crantus P. Rand, thence again bounded North-  
erly by said land now or formerly of said Rand  
to Plymouth Street; Easterly by said Plymouth  
Street, Southerly by land of the heirs of Bela Reed,  
land of Ezekiel Reed and said Island Grove Pond  
and Westerly by said Pond. Being the same premises  
known as Island Grove and described in a  
deed from Jacob and Elizabeth P. Reed to said grantors,  
dated 14 April A.D. 1881 and recorded in Ply-  
mouth County Registry of Deeds Book 1474 Page 250.  
reference thereto being had for a more particular  
description hereby.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging,  
to the said Inhabitants of the Town of Abington and  
their successors, heirs and assigns, to their own use and benefit forever.

And we do hereby, for obliged, and we, heirs, executors, and administrators,  
povernent with the said grantee's and their successors, heirs and assigns, that we shall lawfully  
seize in fee-simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances, except the lease for  
fifteen months of that part of said lot which borders on Plymouth Street to the Old Colony Rail road  
and the right of way and easement and right of way and right of way and right of way and right of way  
that we have good right to sell and convey the same as heretofore and that we will  
and we, heirs, executors and administrators shall WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the said  
grantee's and their successors, heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all  
persons.

And for the consideration aforesaid I Jane B. Wilkes wife of said  
Bela Wilkes.

do hereby release unto the said grantee's and their successors, heirs and assigns, all right of or to both  
DOWER AND HOMESTEAD in the granted premises.
