

# Know all men by these presents

that I, Josiah C. Myer and Florence G. Myer, both of Brockton,  
in the County of Plymouth and Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In consideration of one dollar and other valuable considerations  
paid by Frank G. Wind of said Brockton.

The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said  
Frank G. Wind, a certain lot of land situated on the South side  
of West Elm and East side of Beaver Street in said Brockton,  
bounded as follows: Beginning at the corner of said west Elm and Beaver Street as above  
described, thence westerly in South line of said West Elm Street  
seventy-four (74) feet to lot number 37; thence southerly in the  
line of said lot numbered 37 one hundred and Twenty (120) feet  
to lot numbered 38; thence westerly in line of said lot numbered  
36, seventy-four (74) feet to the East line of said Beaver Street;  
thence northerly in the East line of said Beaver Street one hundred  
and twenty (120) feet to the point of beginning.

Being lot numbered (39) in a Plan of House Lots at Oak  
Hill belonging to Albert Blanchard and Louis A. Johnson, Brockton,  
Mass. August 15, 1889, filed in Plymouth County Registry of Deeds,  
with a right of way over said Beaver Street in common with  
others.

Subject to taxes for the year 1919.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging  
to the said Frank G. Wind  
and his heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.  
And we, hereby, for ourselves and our heirs, executors, and administrators,  
COVENANT with the grantees and their heirs and assigns, that with all  
lawfully soled in fee-simple of the granted premises; that they are free from all incumbrances,  
except as aforesaid.

that we have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that we will, and  
our heirs, executors, and administrators shall WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the  
grantees and their heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all  
persons, except as aforesaid.

And for the consideration aforesaid, with I., Marshall Gertrude Myer, wife of  
Josiah C. Myer,

do hereby release unto the said grantees and their heirs and assigns, all right of or to both  
DOWER and HOMESTEAD in the granted premises, and all other rights and interests therein.
