That I William F freeman do now & then & hereafter doth acknowledge  
to witness unto this my last will

in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars  
paid by the town of Duxbury in the Commonwealth

the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell, and convey unto the said Town of Duxbury in twenty rods & land off or the homestead to purple brick house in Town house in the use of said Town as follows beginning at the Southwest corner of the same in the Northwest corner of the Parish lot there Southwesterly being & a half degree East true rods & ten links to the corner of the same bearing North fifty degrees East by rods one half rods bearing North thirty seven & one half rods West true rods & ten links thence South fifty degrees West by rods & twelve & a half rods to the first bounds said Freeman to make & maintain all the fence between said lot & his land.

To HAVE and to HOLD the afore granted premises to the said Town of Duxbury ~~house and assigns~~, to used toward use and behoof forever  
And I do covenant with the said Town of Duxbury  
~~heirs and assigns~~, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the afore granted premises, that they are free of all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Town of Duxbury  
And that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Town of Duxbury ~~heirs and assigns~~ forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons
