

**DUXBURY, 1879**  
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**DUXBURY BEACH**

Duxbury Beach is a beautiful white sand, six mile long barrier beach currently owned by the Duxbury Beach Reservation, Inc., a non-profit trust. It is a unique and ever shaping natural resource on the Atlantic Coast of the South Shore of Massachusetts. Access to the beach is achieved by either traveling over the wooden Powder Point Bridge, originally built in 1892, or through Gurnet Road.

Duxbury's barrier beach serves as a recreational, scenic, conservation area and a natural breakwater for the towns of Duxbury, Kingston and Plymouth. Duxbury Beach and its adjacent salt marshes continue to be the home of countless species of wildlife and beach creatures in an annual cycle of birth and migration. It has gone through many different ownerships, including potential developers, before being transferred in 1975 to its present owner. Through the continued vigilance of its present owner, it will continue to be one of Plymouth County's most wonderful places.
