

# Know all Men by these Presents,

that I, Sylphamus Mc Nash, of Abington, in the County of Plymouth and Commonwealth of Massachusetts,

In consideration of Two Hundred Dollars to me,  
paid by Theresa Schindler, wife of Horatio Schindler, of  
Boston in the County of Suffolk in said Commonwealth  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, I, Horatio White, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said  
Horatio Schindler, and her heirs, right, or certain lot or  
parcel of land, with the improvements and buildings  
thereon, lying in Plymouth, in said County of Plymouth,  
bounded and described as follows, viz: Beginning at a  
stake and stones on the Easterly side of the highway  
leading from the dwelling house of Joseph White to  
Plymouth, it being the Southwesterly corner bound of  
Collis C. Sawyer's land; thence Easterly by said Sawyer's  
land to land of said White; thence Southerly by said  
White's land land the East Monomoyt Pond to the  
Narragansett (so called); thence southerly said Narragansett to  
the West Monomoyt Pond; thence Northerly by said  
West Monomoyt Pond to a stake and stones; thence  
Easterly in a parallel course with the Southerly line  
of Southwesterly land to the highway; thence southerly  
to opposite of the first named bound. Together with  
thirteen diverse doors and locks and other parts used  
by me in alterations with said premises. Said land  
being the whole of a lot of land which John Howard  
conveyed to Francis J. Howard, except one acre on the  
Southerly side of and adjoining said doors and locks.  
And this same described in a deed from David H. Gibbs  
to me dated October 2<sup>nd</sup> 1884, and recorded in Plymouth  
Register of Deeds, Book 506, page 26.

I do hereby grant, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging,  
to the said Theresa Schindler, and her heirs, right

and heirs, heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.

And I do hereby, for myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators,  
covenant with the said Theresa and her heirs and assigns, that I am  
lawfully seized in fee-simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances,

that I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I will, and  
my heirs, executors, and administrators shall, WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the said  
grantee and her heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all  
persons.

and for the consideration aforesaid, I, Anna W. Nash, wife of said  
Sylphamus Mc Nash, do hereby release unto the said grantees and her heirs and assigns, all right of or to both  
POWER and HOMESTEAD in the granted premises.
