## JAMES MICHAEL CURLEY GOVERNOR, MAYOR OF BOSTON ELECTED MAYOR IN FOUR SEPARATE DECADES

One of the most colorful personalities in Massachusetts political history was James Michael Curley. Curley and his wife bought a summer home on Spring Street in Hull in 1914. Curley served in elected office many times over a 50 year span. He served as a member of the Common Council, was a State Representative, an Alderman, a City Councilor, U. S. Congressman (twice), Mayor of Boston (four times), and Massachusetts Governor. He was elected Mayor of Boston in four different decades. Two bronze statues honor James Michael Curley between the Government Center and Faneuil Hall.
