

Know all Men by these Presents,

that I, Edward A. Perry, of South Hanover, Plymouth County and State of Massachusetts,

In consideration of Thirteen Hundred Twenty-six ⁴⁰ Dollars paid by Mrs. Olive T. Blackman of Marshfield, in said County, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said Olive T. Blackman her heirs and assigns forever A certain Lot of Land, at Branch's Island, so called, in said County, containing One Hundred Acres, more or less, bounded Northly by Land formerly of Peleg Keene, deceased, and Frank Rock Creek, Easterly by the Sea, Southerly by the Sea, Westwards Point, and Green's Harbor River, and Westerly by said River, and Frank Rock Creek, with the Buildings thereon, being all the Farm on said Branch's Island, and Land adjoining, formerly owned by Gideon Hanlon, deceased, excepting, and reserving, all the Lots, or parcels of Land, that have been sold unexcepted, within the bounds of the premises herein described and bounded. The above described Real Estate is the same premises conveyed to me, by a Power of Sale, from Smith Situate Savings Bank, dated May 8th 1880, and recorded at Plymouth Bank 461 Pages 32 and 33.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Olive T. Blackman

and her heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoef forever.

And I do hereby, for myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant with the grantee and her heirs and assigns, that lawfully seized in fee simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances, made or suffered by me.

that I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I will, and my heirs, executors, and administrators shall WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the grantee and her heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by themselves, or under them, but against none other.

And for the consideration aforesaid I, Mary B. Perry, wife of Edward A. Perry,

do hereby release unto the said grantee and her heirs and assigns, all right of or to both DOWER and HOMESTEAD in the granted premises.
