

I now all ready by these presents, that I Bourne Spoorer of Plymouth
 in the County of Plymouth before me in Consideration of Six hundred
 Dollars to me paid by the Plymouth Bridge Company, the receipt whereof
 I do hereby acknowledge do by these presents give grant bargain sell and convey
 unto the said Plymouth Bridge Company their Successors and assigns, a certain
 mill dam and privilege known by the name of Jackson's Grist Mill situated
 on the farm of Barnabas Hedge Edge now in the occupation of Thomas Jackson
 with all rights to the stream above and below said dam which have heretofore
 been enjoyed by the owners of said mill, also the right of raising said dam to such
 a height as may be necessary to carry such works as the said Plymouth Bridge
 Company may erect and the privilege of taking sand and gravel from
 said farm where it will be most convenient to said Plymouth Bridge
 Company and least prejudicial to the owner of said farm for raising and
 repairing said dam, also a newwalk lot on the farm aforesaid bounded as
 follows beginning at a stake in bush and foot on the fence between the farm of
 said Barnabas Hedge and land belonging to the children of said Thomas
 Jackson, thence running North twelve degrees West twenty One rods and two
 thirds of a rod to a stake, thence South forty One degrees West thirty feet to a
 stake, thence North forty three degrees West sixty feet to a stake, thence
 forty one degrees East thirty feet to a stake, thence North forty nine degrees
 West forty three rods and twenty two links to land of Daniel Jackson to a stake
 thence North fifty two degrees East thirty One feet by said Daniel Jackson's
 line to a stake, thence South forty three degrees East sixty two rods and ten links
 to a stake, thence North forty one degrees East twenty six feet to a stake, thence
 South forty nine degrees East twelve rods and twenty one links to a stake
 and post in the fence aforesaid between the land belonging to said Hedge and the
 land belonging to the said children of said Thomas Jackson, thence South fifty
 seven degrees west sixteen rods and twenty four links to the land first mentioned
 also the privilege of using so much of the land on each side of the aforesaid dam
 as may be necessary for building a newwalk on the same and repairing,
 whenever it may be needfull also the privilege of projecting the underpinning
 or foundation of said newwalk beyond the sides of said building on to the land
 adjoining said newwalk if it shall be found necessary, also the liberty of
 Hedge North sixty One degrees and one quarter East twelve rods and twenty three
 links to a heap of stones, thence North thirty degrees west One rod and fifteen links to
 a heap of stones, thence South fifty seven degrees West eight rods and nine links to
 the brook aforesaid thence by said brook South one degree and seven rods
 and fifteen links to the bounds first mentioned, excepting the right which the heirs
 of Samuel Jackson have of fowling and trapping on the northwesterly side of
 successors and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of themselves
 and Hannah B. wife of the said Bourne Spoorer in Consideration of One
 Dollar to her paid, the receipt whereof she acknowledge doth hereby release
 to the said Plymouth Bridge Company all her rights and titles of claim in
 the aforesigned premises, In testimony whereof I the said Bourne Spoorer
 and Hannah B. my wife have hereunto set our hands and seals this twenty
 first day of August in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred
 and twenty four. Bourne Spoorer (Seal)
