KEN COLEMAN RED SOX BROADCASTER VOICE OF "THE IMPOSSIBLE DREAM"

Ken Coleman was a legendary radio and television broadcaster for the Boston Red Sox for over 20 years. He is most remembered for being an announcer in the 1967 season, the year the Sox overcame 100 - 1 odds to win the American League pennant on the last day of the season. That dramatic finish gave birth to Red Sox Nation and was dubbed by Coleman "The Impossible Dream". Coleman later narrated an audio tribute to the season by that name. He also served as broadcaster for the Cleveland Indians, the Cleveland Browns and the Cincinnati Reds. Ken Coleman was also the second director of the Jimmy Fund and was a longtime supporter of the Jimmy Fund. He was inducted into the Red Sox Hall of Fame in 2000.
