MONPONSETT PONDS - PART OF WAMPANOAG CANOE PASSAGE

For over 10,000 years, the Monponsett Ponds have been an important feature in what is now Plymouth County. The Wampanoag People used the ponds as a means of travel between their summer and winter seasonal homes by way of what is now referred to as the Wampanoag Canoe Passage.

On property purchased in 1886, Moritz and Therese Schindler expanded their home they had built on West Monponsett Pond into the Monponsett Inn. Visitors enjoyed the fishing, bathing and swimming the pond offered.

Although the inn was destroyed twice by fires and rebuilt several times, this location in the heart of Plymouth County, has been the site of weddings, anniversaries and other joyous occasions for over 100 years.
