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Know all Men by these Presents,

I, Deoratis Adams, of Hingham, in the County of Plymouth
and Commonwealth of Massachusetts,

In consideration of One dollar and other valuable considerations to me
paid by The Town of Hingham aforesaid.

The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said Town of Hingham, a certain lot or parcel of land, situated in said Hingham on the easterly side of Summer Street, so called, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on said street, at the Northwesterly corner of other land of the grantor, thence North Twenty-eight and one half (28 $\frac{1}{2}$) degree West Five (5) rods and Fourteen links to land of S. B. Barnsford, thence North Sixty-one and one half (61 $\frac{1}{2}$) degree East, Seven and one half (7 $\frac{1}{2}$) rods, thence South Twenty-eight and one half (28 $\frac{1}{2}$) degree East, Five (5) rods and fourteen (14) links, thence South Sixty-one and one half (61 $\frac{1}{2}$) degree West Seven and one half (7 $\frac{1}{2}$) rods to the point of beginning. The said parcel of land is herein conveyed to be used as a site for the erection of a building, as provided for in the will of the late Frederick S. Adams, to be used for the purpose of a public library, for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Hingham.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Town of Hingham, and its successors and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever. And I do hereby, for myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant with the grantees and its successors and assigns, that I am fully seized in fee simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances, made or suffered by me except as aforesaid.

That I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I will, and my heirs, executors, and administrators shall WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the said grantees and its successors and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by, through, or under me except as aforesaid, but against none other.

And for the consideration aforesaid, I do hereby, by Charlotte S. Adams, wife of the above Deoratis Adams,

do hereby release unto the said grantees and its successors and assigns, all right of or to both DOWER and HOMESTEAD in the granted premises.
