Drence Gour:

I know all men by these presents That captaine Thomas Willett of Plymouth habt. sold assigned and sell over unto William Bradford of the same place Gour: for and in consideration of seauen pounds sterlincg To him in hand now payed one hundred acres of upland lying between or neare to Joneses River and the pond to the Northwest of Joneses River swamp and the halfe of all the meadows lying about or neare unto the said pond therunto belonging and the full halfe of all that pissell of land lying below att Joneses River esteem'd att an hundred acres be it more or lese That is to say that halfe lying next adjoining to the lands of the aforesaid William Bradford which hee bought of Abraham Peirce To our up in length and range as his other lots doe there and butting to the Eastward on Joneses River and to the Southward bound'd with the lands of Mr Done all which possells of uplands and meadows with all the appurtenances privilidges emunitiess and rights any way therunto belonging or that may accrue The aforesaid Thomas Willett doth hereby give graunt alien sell ratify and confirme To the said William Bradford to have and to hold for him and his heires for ever In witness whereof hee hath sett his hand and seal this twenty eight of February 1653 above Mary his wife hath given her free consent therunto -
