#### MID-SUMMER DOLDRUMS

The number of Plymouth County sales dipped for the first time since April, while refinance activity continued to remain in the doldrums in July, reported Plymouth County Register of Deeds John R. Buckley, Jr.

The volume of sales recorded in Plymouth County had been climbing slowly since April, from 534 in April to 815 in June. That trend came to an end in July as the number of deeds recorded in Plymouth County slipped to 644. At the same time, sale prices have continued to stabilize. Through the first seven months of this year, the average sale price reached \$611,105, representing a 1% increase from the \$603,984 average through the same period in 2022.

The Federal Reserve once again raised the interest rate, this time by a quarter of a point, bringing the current interest rate to its highest rate (5.25 - 5.5%) in twenty-two (22) years. With the increase it is likely that the refinance market will remain stalled. 1,067 mortgages were recorded in July, significantly less than the 1,578 mortgages recorded last July. This represents a 32% decrease in recordings. Between January and July of 2022, 12,898 mortgages had gone to record in Plymouth County. During the same seven month period this year, that number fell 43% to 7,373. At the same time, the average mortgage amount has dropped 3%, from \$352,986 through July of 2022, to \$341,671 during the same period this year.

Foreclosure figures have remained relatively modest, even with the federal moratorium well behind us. Plymouth County recorded 36 notices initiating new foreclosure proceedings in July of this year, down from 39 in July of 2022. The total number of notices filed through the first seven months of the year has risen 39%, from 245 in 2022, to 341 this year.

Plymouth County recorded 8 foreclosure deeds in July, down from 12 in June, bringing the total number recorded so far this year to 74. At the same point in 2022, Plymouth County had recorded 55 foreclosure deeds, representing a 35% increase so far this year.

As part of our ongoing effort to share with the public some of America's oldest land records, we are attaching a record that expands on last month's colonial record by setting forth the boundaries of Plymouth Colony in the year of 1658. It reads "all that pte of America ... that lyeth within or between a sertaine Rivolett or Rundelett comonly

called Coahassett allis Conahassett towards the north; and the ... Narragansett Riuer towards the south and the great Westeren Ocean towards the East; ... extending into the maine towars the west; from the mouth of the said Riuer called Narraganssett Riuer to the vtmost bounds and lymetts of a Countrey or place in New England called Pokanacutt ... allis Sowamsett westwards; ... and all lands Riuers waters hauens creekes ports ffishings fowlings; and all heredetiments profitts Comodities and emoluments whatsoeuer; ... furthermore all that Tract or pte of land in New England or pte of america aforsaid which lyeth ... and extendeth ... from the vtmost lymetts of Cobbasecontee ... which adjoyneth to the Riuer of Kennebecke ... towards the westeren Ocean; and a place called the falls at Nequamkicke in America aforesaid; and the space of fifteen English miles on each side of the said Riuer commonly called Kenebecke Riuer; that lyeth within the said bounds Eastwards Westwards Northwards and southwards last aboue mentioned... together with free Ingresse egresse and Regresse with shipps boates shallops and other vessels from the sea called the westeren ocean."
